HEART HAVENS

In 1993, a parent of an adult with a developmental disability in Virginia asked her United Methodist pastor a very simple question: "Where will my child live when I'm gone?" That question exposed the real and urgent need for residential services for people with a developmental disability in Virginia. As a result of that question, the Virginia United Methodist Conference Commission on Ministry to Persons with Handicapping Conditions (now the Commission on Disabilities) began researching the possibility of developing residential services for adults with a developmental disability. Heart Havens was born out of those studies, and the very first Heart Havens home (our Macleigh-Holland home) opened in Virginia Beach in 1999. Though we now operate independently from the Virginia United Methodist Conference, the Christian principles of our founding are very much in place.

Heart Havens is a nonprofit organization that provides residential support to adults with a developmental disability, but it's so much more than a roof and a bed. We empower people to discover what they love and pursue their hopes and dreams. Big or small, we support people as they find a way to make their goals and dreams happen. We use a person-centered process to ensure that everyone we support is living their best life, being a part of the community in the ways they truly want and making decisions for themselves every day. Heart Havens is licensed by the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Development Services and is an approved Medicaid provider. We were founded by the Virginia Conference of the United Methodist Church, though we now operate independently from the Virginia Conference under the direction of a Board of Directors. However, the Christian principles of our mission are very much in place.

Their mission and vision is to empower adults with a developmental disability to live and thrive in a safe and nurturing environment and to be the premier provider of person-centered supports for people with a developmental disability throughout Virginia.

VIRGINIA U. M. ADVOCATE

We have six United Methodist schools in Virginia educating strong lay and clergy leaders for our conference, even though some of the students enter with no religious preference. Under the guidance of the chaplain at each school, students learn to serve others in the name of Christ, and for many, it is their first encounter with the work of the church. The cover articles in the January issue highlight what each school is doing to build disciples, including a Ferrum College team assisting the same family in Waverly that Beulah has served. This issue includes a letter from a pastor in an area that will be negatively impacted by a pipeline and commentary about declining church membership and finances. (Are our churches ready for the graduates of our schools?)
